1+1 MBA Program

UWest + Fo Guang University

Overview

The 1+1 MBA program is an intensive two-year program in collaboration between University of the West (hereafter "UWest") and its sister school in Taiwan – Fo Guang University (hereafter "FGU").

MBA students from FGU can earn an MBA in International Business or an MBA in another concentration from UWest (see below).

UWest MBA Admission Requirements

Basic admission requirements to the UWest MBA program include:

- Minimum GPA (Undergraduate Grade Point Average): 2.50
- TOEFL Internet Based Test (Test of English as a Foreign Language):

Graduation Requirements

In order to receive the MBA from UWest, students must complete a minimum 40 units*, including 1 unit of internship in the U.S. All instruction at UWest is in English.

* Up to 18 units of credit may be transferred from FGU contingent on the following:

- The courses taken at FGU were for graduate credit
- The courses taken are equivalent to UWest courses in content, level, and credit hours.
- The grades earned were B or better.

MBA in International Business

The following outlines the curriculum requirements for receiving an MBA in International Business.

- I) Prerequisite (Foundation) Requirements: Students with an undergraduate degree in a field other than business may be required to complete up to 15 units of prerequisite coursework in addition to the 40 units required for graduation. (Note: These units are not applicable toward the MBA degree. They may be completed at FGU and waived after transcript evaluation.)
 - BUS 200 Business Law (3 units)
 - BUS 201 Principles of Microeconomics (3 units)
 or BUS 202 Principles of Macroeconomics (3 units)
 - BUS 210 Introduction to Financial Accounting (3 units)
 - BUS 303 Business Statistics (3 units)
 - BUS 306 Business Communications (3 units)

II) MBA Core Courses (21 units)

Students are required to take seven core courses (21 units) as follows:

- MBA 504 Principles of Management (3 units)
 or MBA 520 Organization & Management (3 units)
- MBA 507 Managerial Economics (3 units)
- MBA 513 Managerial Accounting (3 units)
- MBA 515 Corporate Finance (3 units)
- MBA 530 Marketing (3 units)
- MBA 540 Management Information Systems (3 units)
- MBA 588 Business Philosophy & Ethics (3 units)

III) Capstone Course (3 units)

MBA 580 Strategic Management (3 units)

IV) Required International Business Course (3 units)

Students will be required to take MBA 550 International Business which serves as the foundation for concentration coursework in International Business.

V) Concentration Courses in International Business (6 units)

Students must complete at least 6 units of coursework in the International Business concentration selected among the following courses:

- MBA 516 International Finance (3 units)
- MBA 533 International Marketing (3 units)
- MBA 551 Importing and Exporting (3 units)
- MBA 552 International Business Law (3 units)
- MBA 556 Global Economy (3 units)
- MBA 557 Social Entrepreneurship (3 units)
- MBA 558 Seminar on Doing Business in Asia (3 units)
- MBA 559 Seminar on Doing Business in the U.S. (3 units)
- MBA 568 Special Topic on International Accounting (3 units)
- MBA 587 Seminar on Business Negotiations (3 units)
- MBA 589 Seminar on Entrepreneurship (3 units)

VI) Elective Courses (6 units)

Students must complete an additional 6 units of electives (two courses) from the courses listed above or from any of the other courses offered in the MBA curriculum (subject to course prerequisites).

VII) internship (1 unit)

All UWest MBA students must complete an internship in the U.S. approved by the program advisor and department chair. The focus of the internship will be on international business. Internships can be completed between the Fall and Spring semesters at UWest along with any remaining courses needed to fulfill the requirements of the MBA degree.

MBA in Other Concentrations

In addition to meeting the prerequisite (foundation), the core, and the internship requirements, students may concentrate in any one of the additional concentrations:

MBA Concentrations (9 units): The concentration requires the completion of three courses (9 units) in the selected concentration.
